1 GATEWAY

- An engaging museum experience: exhibits, galleries, film, hands-on activities, and more
- Future home of the award-winning USS Constitution Museum with expanded galleries
- Engage all ages in the stories of "Old Ironsides", maritime heritage, and naval service
- Orientation to USS Constitution, the Navy Yard, and Freedom Trail
- Access to historic ships, connections to Harbor Walk, and Bunker Hill
- Outdoor waterfront space for special events, food, and retail venues

2 GREAT STORIES

- Interpret great stories from the Navy Yard's 218-year history and beyond
- Move USS Cassin Young into Dry Dock 1 as an interpretive exhibit on ship repair
- Develop Building 10 as an interpretive transition between USS Constitution (War of 1812) and USS Cassin Young (World War II)

(3) THE GREAT LAWN

- Enlarge the Commandant's Lawn allowing for community events, concerts, and private functions
- Encourage fitness through the use of tennis/basketball courts and exercise stations
- Create an enhanced east/west walking connection along 2nd Avenue
- Re-establish Victory Gardens for community activities and engagement

4 THE WATERFRONT

- Activate Pier 1 with programs, food, festivals, special yearround activities, and opportunities to enjoy views of the city and harbor
- Enhance Pier 1 to accommodate visiting ships and floating food/activity barges
- Construct a steel, ghosted structure in place of Building 109 to provide shade and house events and programming
- Increase boat access and develop Freedom Trail tours that connect Boston Harbor to the shoreside sites and stories
